

## REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR REGISTRATION AT UFSC

1. Identification documents (Brazilian ID, passport, home country ID card and CPF) as provided by the applicant when submitting their application for the UFSC Admission Selection Process for Refugees 2025;
2. Document proving equivalence to the completion of secondary education abroad, issued by the State Council of Education; or a secondary school diploma and transcript (or equivalent), if completed in Brazil. Applicants who hold a higher education degree must also present the degree certificate (diploma);
3. Certificate of vaccination against rubella (required for female applicants up to 40 years old, in accordance with Law no. 10196/1996/SC);
4. Self-declaration of refugee status, low-income asylum seeker status or humanitarian visa holder status, and self-declaration of income (required for applicants who have claimed asylum and whose gross per capita family income is equal to or less than one and a half times the minimum wage), validated by the PROAFE committee. 5. Proof of vaccination against COVID-19 – applicants may submit, as proof of vaccination, the vaccination certificate issued by the *ConecteSUS* platform or a proof/booklet/card/passport of vaccination printed on letterhead, issued at the time of vaccination by a Brazilian or foreign government institution, with legible data and the correct identification of the holder. Applicants with a contraindication to getting the COVID-19 vaccine must present a medical certificate justifying the contraindication, with precise medical information in this regard.

Presented below is information from the UFSC Epidemiological Monitoring Committee based on the recent recommendations by the Florianópolis Epidemiological Surveillance Authority and the Ministry of Health regarding the COVID-19 vaccination strategy.

- The required vaccination schedule is of at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.

- For the general population (without comorbidities), the vaccination schedule is considered complete if they have already received one or more doses (monovalent or bivalent).

- If vaccination is not available through the public health system, applicants who have not yet received any dose must submit a commitment form, available at <https://dae.ufsc.br/formularios/>, committing to provide proof of vaccination to UFSC by the end of the semester of admission.
